

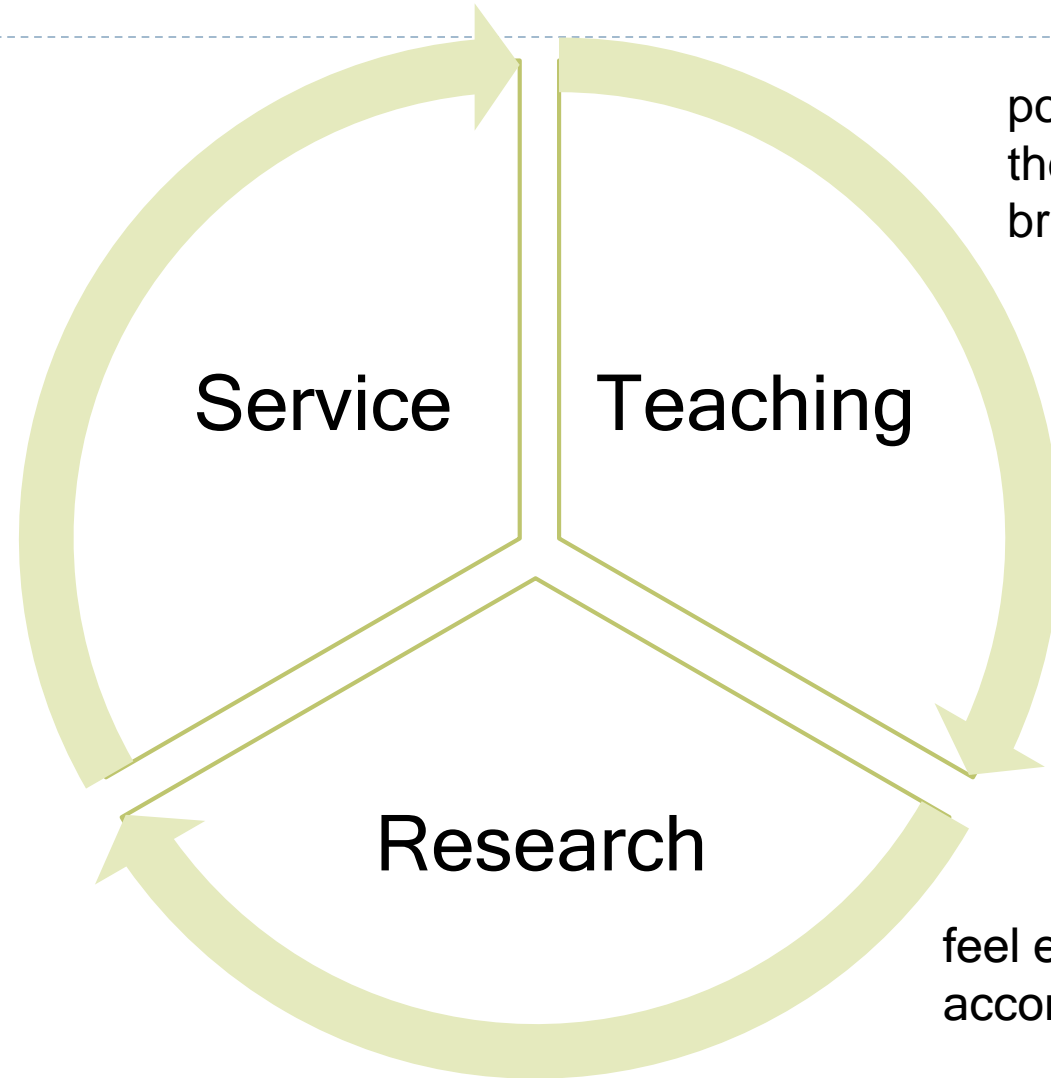

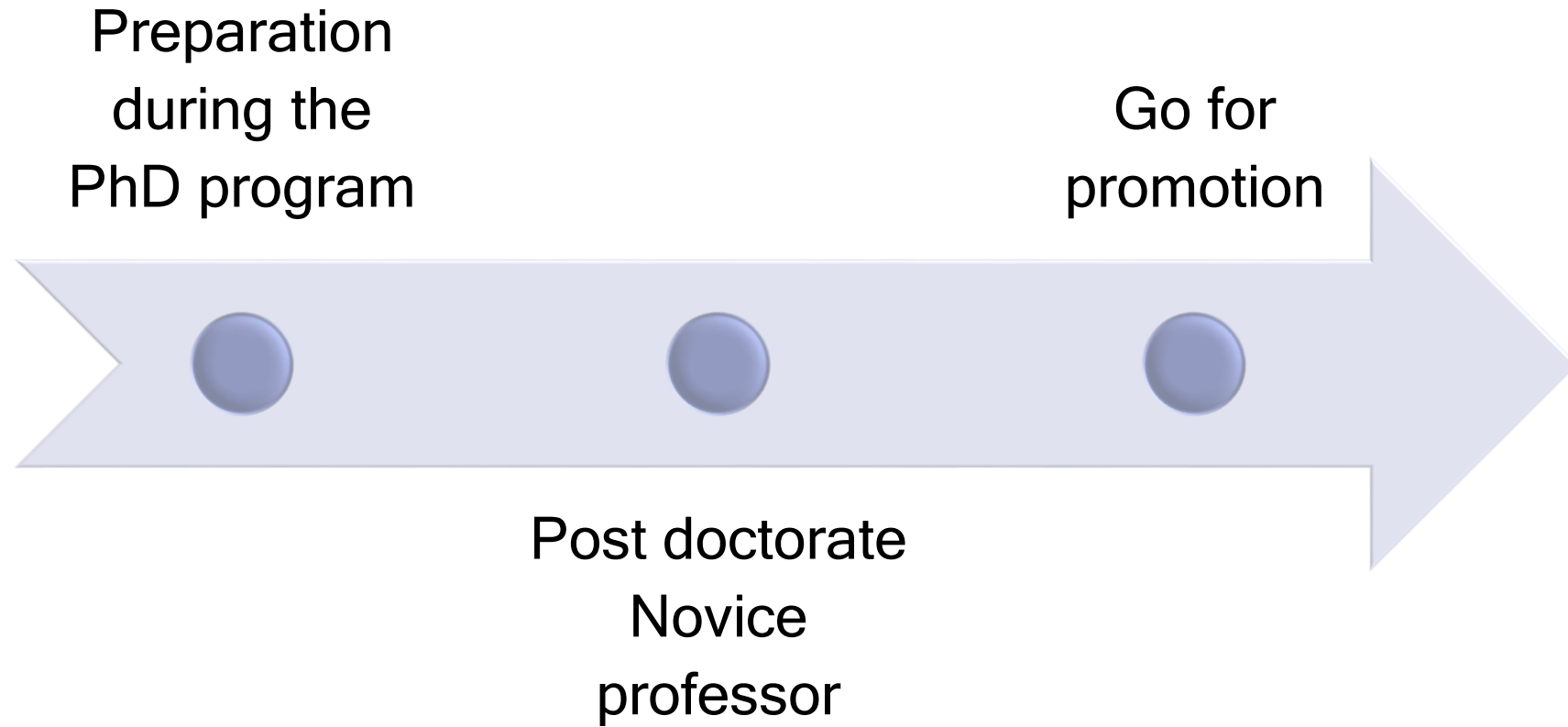
Being a University Professor

Ideally

- ▶ being a professor is “mission impossible,” because this highly competitive field requires not only intelligence but also persistence and hard work, which is beyond many people’s ability.

Actually

- ▶ have a hard time to achieve a balance to take care of all their family responsibilities while meeting all the requirements and being distinguished in their professional life. Most professors said that this kind of life was challenging and tough rather than enjoyable and talked a lot about the conflicts they have had.



1. Preparation during the PhD program

Formal

- ▶ preparatory classes

Informal

- ▶ assistance from professors
- ▶ participation in academic activities
- ▶ gathering information, and
- ▶ observing tenure-track professors

2. Manage your fragmented time

- ▶ A typical day is spent teaching, research, meetings, answering emails.
- ▶ start very early in the morning with some writing
- ▶ have 'have-to-do' list
- ▶ summer offers an alternative for having extended blocks of time to devote to research and writing

3. Working extra hours at night or over weekends

- ▶ “I am often in my office on Saturday catching up with my jobs that were not able to be done the previous week or getting ready for next week”

4. Take advantage of the university's Assistance
